<u>Minutes</u> Bill made a motion to accept the April 2016 Meeting Minutes as presented. Alton seconded and Dave voted yes.

<u>Road Report</u> Bill reported the following April activities: installed new sluice pipes on Upper Rhiney, Lower Rhiney, Muckey, Jones, Camp, Hunsinger, Valley View, and Stone Crop; removed pot holes on English and Shadow Brook; and worked Muckey road.
